


In 2017: 182,527 (14.5% of all students) were enrolled externally.

- •2% identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.
- •67% identified as female.
- •3% were younger than 20 years of age.
- •7% were more than 50 years of age.
- •13% were born outside Australia.
- •5% identified as having a disability.
- •2% identified as non-English speaking background

They live in every state and territory, and not necessarily yours.

You can't spot them in a crowd, in your staff room, on your campus - including when they are enrolled at another institution.

Hunch: they attrit more because of (1) life circumstances and (2) they are studying one unit...(30 they often move or come back later.
