

Provider Information Request – Requirements for reporting in 2021

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Overview of reporting requirements

The Provider Information Request (PIR) is a request for information under Section 28 of the *Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011* (TEQSA Act). This document sets out the reporting requirements for the Provider Information Request (PIR) for implementation in 2021.

All data is reported in data packets, as described in this document. Each packet comprises data elements. Detailed specifications for each data element is available from <https://heimshelp.education.gov.au/resources/TCSI>.

Some data packets include 'extensions', which enable providers to report more than one value for a data element or a group of data elements. These groups may be time-based and allow the reporting of changes in the characteristic of a course, student, etc. through time.

Reporting method

All data can be reported through:

- an application programming interface (API) from each provider's student management system to the Government or
- TCSI Data Entry.

Providers can report new and revised data as soon as the data is available. The system can receive information about past events and some events that are planned to occur (e.g. the establishment of a course in the following year).

Revisions

All corrections and updates to data that have already been reported must be made before the reporting deadline.

Compliance with due dates

Late reporting may result in a breach of the TEQSA Act and can affect registration. It is important that providers allocate enough time to prepare, validate and submit data before the applicable deadline.

The PIR course of study packet is used to report data on what courses of study are offered by each provider. The data collected through a PIR course of study packet is referenced by one or more PIR course packets.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR course of study packet for each course of study in which they intend to admit one or more students.

Initial reporting requirement

Uniqueness

Each PIR course of study packet:

- must have a value for the course of study code (E533) that is unique to the provider
- should have a value for the course of study name (E394) that is unique to the provider.

Revising data

A provider can correct data already in a PIR course of study packet after the initial packet is reported, with the following limitations:

- the course of study type (E310) cannot be changed from a higher degree by research course ('02' or '03') to a non-higher degree by research course if the PIR course of study packet has linked data
- a PIR course of study packet cannot be deleted if it is linked to an active course record.

All revisions made to elements in the PIR course of study packet will apply to all enrolment records linked to the course of study, including historical enrolment and completion records. Revisions

should therefore only be made where data has been incorrectly reported through a genuine administrative error. Where there is an actual change to a course of study, it should not be made by revising an existing course of study but instead by creating a new course of study record.

About

The PIR course packet is used to report data on the courses offered by each provider. Each PIR course packet must be linked to an established PIR course of study packet. The data collected through a PIR course packet may be referenced by one or more:

- PIR course on campus packets
- PIR course admission packets
- PIR exit awards packets.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR course packet for each course in which they intend to admit or complete one or more students.

Each PIR course packet must have a value for E307 (course code) that is unique to the provider.

A provider can update, correct or add data already submitted through a PIR course packet after the initial packet is reported, as per the table below.

A PIR course packet cannot be deleted if it is linked to an active course admission.

If there is an actual change through time (not a data correction) for the field of education codes (E461/E462) for a course, these are to be reported by creating a new PIR course fields of education packet, which enables the start date of that change to be reported.

About

The PIR course fields of education (CFE) packet is used to report changes through time to the fields of education for a given course. The first PIR CFE packet for a course is created as part of the PIR course packet. A provider may create as many additional PIR CFE packets as necessary to report changes to the fields of education for a course through time.

Scope

Providers are required to create a PIR CFE packet only when there is a change to E461 or E462 for a course.

Initial reporting requirements

*These elements must be reported together when a new PIR CFE packet is created

Uniqueness

Each PIR CFE packet must have a value for E609 (field of education effective from date) that is unique for the course.

Revising data

Providers can correct data submitted in a PIR CFE packet, with the following limitations:

- the field of education effective from date (E609) for the first PIR CFE packet cannot be amended as this is a system generated date that remains linked to the course effective from date (E609)
- only the PIR CFE packets at the end of the time series can be deleted
- a field of education effective from date (E609) cannot be amended in a way that would create a gap or overlap in the time series of CFE data for a course.

Deleting a course will delete PIR CFE packets linked to the course.

About

The PIR campus packet is used to report data on the campuses from which providers deliver their courses. The data collected through a PIR campus packet is referenced by one or more PIR course on campus packets.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR campus packet for each campus from which it delivers one or more courses that are within the scope of the PIR course on campus packet.

Initial reporting requirement

Uniqueness

Each PIR campus packet must:

- for campuses in Australia, have a combination of campus suburb (E525) and the campus postcode (E559) that is unique to the provider
- for campuses not in Australia, have a combination campus country code (E644) and campus suburb (E525) that is unique to the provider.

Revising data

A provider can update or correct the data already in a PIR campus packet after the initial packet is reported, as per the following table.

A PIR campus packet cannot be deleted if it is linked to an active course on campus record.

About

The PIR course on campus packet is used to report which courses are delivered from which campuses and to provide data on the features of the courses as delivered at each campus. Each PIR course on campus packet must be linked to an established PIR campus packet and an established PIR course packet.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR course on campus packet for every:

- undergraduate course¹ that is undertaken by domestic students at an Australian campus
- postgraduate course work course that is undertaken by domestic students at an Australian campus
- all courses delivered at an offshore campus.

Each PIR course on campus packet must have a combination of campus (UID2 or E525/E644/E559) and course (UID5 or E307) that is unique to the provider.

A provider can update, correct or add to the data already in a PIR course on campus packet after the initial packet is reported, as per the table below.

The PIR student packet is used to report key identity, address and demographic data for students at the provider. The data collected through a PIR student packet is referenced by one or more PIR course admission packets.

Scope

Providers are required to report data for all domestic, overseas, onshore and offshore students enrolled in or undertaking a course of study leading to a higher education award of the organisation.

Uniqueness

Each PIR student packet must have a student identification code (E313) that is unique to the provider.

Revising and adding data

A provider can revise any data already in a PIR student packet after the initial packet is reported as per the table below.

A PIR student packet cannot be deleted if it is linked to an active course admission.

If there is an actual change through time (not a data correction) to the citizen resident code (E358) for a student, that change is to be reported by creating a PIR citizenship packet so that dates are reported to indicate the timing of the change.

If the student reports having more than one disability, additional disability codes (E615) can be reported through the disability packet. If there is an actual change (not a data correction) to a student's disability, this change is also reported using the PIR disability packet so that dates are reported to indicate the timing of the change.

PIR Disability packet

About

The PIR disability packet is used to report disability codes (E615) for a student and changes through time in line with a student's disabilities. A PIR disability packet for a student will be created as part of the PIR student packet if the provider reports a value for the disability code (E615) when the PIR student packet is established. In this case, the disability effective from date (E609) is automatically generated based on the date the PIR student packet was first reported. Providers may amend this date. A provider may create as many PIR disability packets as necessary to add disability codes (E615) for a student.

Scope

Providers may report a PIR disability packet only when a student notifies the provider that:

- they have a disability but this was not reported through the original PIR student packet
- they have two or more disabilities, or
- there has been a change to their disability status.

Uniqueness

Each PIR disability packet must have a value for the disability code (E615) that is unique to the student on any given date, as determined by disability effective dates (E609 and E610).

A provider can update or correct any data already in a PIR disability packet after the initial packet is reported as per the following table.

PIR Citizenship packet

The PIR citizenship packet is used to report changes through time to the citizen resident code (E358) for a student. A PIR citizenship packet for a student will be created as part of the PIR student packet if the provider reports a value for the citizen resident code (E358) when that packet is established. In this case, the citizenship effective from date (E609) is automatically generated based on the date the PIR student packet was first reported. Providers may amend this date. A provider may create as many additional PIR citizenship packets as necessary to report changes to a student's citizenship or residency status through time.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR citizenship packet only when the student's citizen resident code (E358) was not reported through the original PIR student packet or when a student notifies the provider that there has been a change to their citizenship or residency status.

Uniqueness

Each PIR citizenship packet must have a value for citizenship effective from date (E609) that is unique for the student.

Revising data

Providers can correct the data submitted in a PIR citizenship packet and the system-generated citizenship effective from date (E609) for the first reported citizen resident code (E358), with the following limitations:

- only the PIR citizenship packets at the end of the time series can be deleted
- a citizenship effective from date (E609) cannot be amended in a way that would create a gap or overlap in the time series of citizenship data for a student.

The value for the citizen resident code (E358) is to be correct as at the citizenship effective from date (E609).

First reported address packet

The first reported address packet is used to make corrections to the student's first reported residential address data. The initial values for all data elements in the first reported address packet are automatically generated by the system from the first time residential address data reported through the student packet as per the table below. The values in the first reported address packet are not affected by any revisions made to address data in the student packet.

Scope

Providers are required to revise the data in the first reported address packet only when the provider becomes aware that the stored data values do not correctly reflect a student's original residential address.

A provider can correct the data in a first reported address packet after the initial packet is created by the system.

The PIR course admission packet is used to report the admission of students into courses and provide data on aspects of the student's admission and engagement in the course. Each PIR course admission packet must be linked to an established PIR student packet and established PIR course packet. The data collected through a PIR course admission packet may be referenced by one or more PIR unit enrolment packets.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR course admission packet each time a student is admitted to a course of the provider where the student may need to enrol in units of study to complete the course.

Uniqueness

Each PIR course admission packet must have a unique combination of values for:

- student (UID8 or E313)
- course (UID5 or E307)
- course of study commencement date (E534).

The combination of student (UID8 or E313), course (UID5 or E307) and course of study commencement date (E534) must also be unique across all PIR course admissions packets for the provider.

Revising and adding data

A provider can revise any data already in a PIR course admission packet after the initial packet is reported as per the table below.

A PIR course admission packet cannot be deleted if it is linked to an active unit enrolment or exit award record.

The course identifier (UID5 or E307) should only be amended when data has been incorrectly reported through a genuine administrative error. The course identifier must not be revised as a result of a student transferring between courses. A new PIR course admissions packet is to be created in this instance.

If a student has:

- more than one basis for admission into the course, the additional basis for admission code (E327) is to be reported through the PIR basis for admission packet
- credit applied towards the requirements of the course on more than one occasion, the additional credit values and codes (E560, E561 and E566) are to be reported through the PIR course prior credit packet
- more than one specialisation for the course, the additional specialisations (E463) are to be reported through the PIR specialisation packet.

The PIR basis for admission packet is used to report basis for admission codes (E327) for the student's admission into a course. A PIR basis for admission packet for a course admission will be created as part of the PIR course admission packet if the provider reports a value for the basis for admission code (E327) when the PIR course admission packet is established. Otherwise, a provider may create one or two PIR basis for admission packets later to report up to two basis for admission codes (E327) for a course admission.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR basis for admission packet only when the basis for admission code (E327) was not reported through the original PIR course admission packet or when there are two basis for admission codes (E327) that apply to the course admission record.

Initial reporting requirement

Uniqueness

Each PIR basis for admission packet must have a value for basis for admission code (E327) that is unique for the student's course admission.

Revising data

A provider can correct the data in a PIR basis for admission packet after the initial packet is reported. The value on a PIR basis for admission packet is to be correct as at the course of study commencement date (E534).

PIR Course prior credit packet

The PIR course prior credit packet is used to report the credit values and codes (E560, E561 and E566) when credit is applied towards the requirements of the course for the student. A PIR course prior credit packet for a course admission will be created as part of the PIR course admission packet if the provider reports credit values and codes (E560, E561 and E566) when the PIR course admission packet is established. A provider may create as many additional PIR course prior credit packets as necessary to add additional credits that are applied to a course for the student.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR course prior credit packet only when credit is applied to a course for a student and:

- credit is received from more than one source of credit (E561 or E566); or
- credit was not reported as part of the original PIR course admission packet.

A provider can update or correct the data in a PIR course prior credit packet after the initial packet is reported. All values on a PIR course prior credit packet are to be correct as at the current date or the course outcome date (E592), whichever date is earlier.

The PIR specialisation packet is used to report specialisation codes (E463) for the student's course. A PIR specialisation packet for a student in a course will be created as part of the PIR course admission packet if the provider reports a value for the specialisation code (E463) when that PIR course admission packet is established. Otherwise, a provider may create up to four PIR specialisation packets later to report up to four specialisation codes (E463) for a student in a course.

Scope

Providers are required to report a PIR specialisation packet only when the specialisation code (E463) was not reported through the original PIR course admission packet or when two or more specialisation codes (E463) apply to a student in a course.

Initial reporting requirement

Uniqueness

Each PIR specialisation packet must have a value for specialisation code (E463) that is unique for the student in the course.

Revising data
