Focus areas

- Application is in the approved form and evidence is clearly labelled.
- Evidence of a **formally constituted and accountable governing body** that is exercising competent governance oversight of all of its proposed higher education operations.
- The Higher Education Standards are **met** at the time of application.
- **Ready to commence delivery**, with the necessary processes and resources in place to be able to start delivering quality higher education within a reasonable timeframe after obtaining registration.
- Have sufficient financial resources to remain financially viable during the length of the registration and apply resources to sustain the quality of the higher education offering.

- Have a cohesive set of policies and procedures that cover all areas of quality assurance and are capable of being implemented.
- Has an appropriate staffing profile for each course of study with sufficient experience to provide academic oversight and meet the needs of students.
- Course development and approved processes that have been reviewed, scrutinised and implemented.
- Academic staff are involved in scholarly activities that inform teaching and learning.
- All key personnel in the organisation are fit and proper persons and do not have a history that would prevent them from being involved with a higher education operation.
